Neil McCarney inquired if the Chief, the Police Services Board Chair or any other member had received any notification that the Town Council was requesting an Ontario Provincial Police Costing. No member was in receipt of any documentation of such request. Neil McCarney voiced how he was disappointed that the Police Services Board had not been notified of the Council's intention. He is preparing a letter voicing his disappointment.

Chief Liu provided an overview of the Budget Analysis. Copies distributed to members. Ross Jeffrey provided an overview of the Differential Report.

Erika Demchuk voiced her concerns about the OMPF Funding and how figures were being calculated, stating that there is padding of figures and that this would be fraud. Chair Warren stated that these are very serious allegations. The Chair then asked the Treasurer, if in his professional opinion he has witnessed any incidents of padding or fraudulent and if so, she would be calling for an immediate investigation. The Treasurer responded "definitely not".

Ross Jeffrey advised the members how OMPF figures were reached. Full costing was never applied in the past and that all attributable overhead should be included to reflect a true costing. The Town did lose money in the past years and the town is simply restoring expenditures that have been missed. There is a formula to be followed.

Chief Liu advised the Board that with the implementation of Part Time Constables there are initial start up costs. However, the bottom line figure meets the 0% increase as requested by the Police Services Board.

Chief Liu is expecting a surplus with the 2011 budget. Bottom figure at 0% with funds being put aside into a contingency fund. Although there is a 12% increase in operational there is a 73% decrease in capital expenditures.

Meeting called to order by Chair Anne Warren

Meeting commenced with Erika Demchuk advising members that she has spoken with several Mayors of other municipalities as well as Steve Clark (not MPP Steve Clark) who works in the office of the Finance Minister to gain information and clarification on the OMPF Funding. She reported that the OMPF funding should not be shown as revenue within the police budget. It is Council's decision where the expenditures lie with the OMPF funding. She further reported that reserve funds can only be retained by Council for the Town and Police are not able to build reserve funds. She also researched costs per households regarding policing, and reported that Gananoque is one of the highest.

Ross Jeffrey spoke further on the OMPF Funding. He has had discussions with OMPF personnel who advised that it is the "OMPF" that determine the amount of the grant made to the Town. He was advised that it is solely at Council's discretion how these funds are utilized.

With regards to the Police Budget he recommends that we retrack our current budget from the Town's Budget meeting and bring it back to council after revisions are made. He feels there is room to make cuts and adjustments. He feels Council will reject this current budget.

Neil McCarney stated that the police budget was prepared and passed by the Board and should go to Council as is. It was requested that the Police come in with a 0% increase which was done. It was voiced that the operational portion of the budget reflects an increase and does not meet the 0% increase.

"WHEREAS in 1994, the Ontario Government approved a pilot project for photo radar on selected highways with high collision experience;

AND WHEREAS the media coverage of the introduction of these units at the time is believed to have resulted in an overall reduction in speeding on all highways in the Province;

AND WHEREAS a reduction in the speed of vehicles results in a reduction in fatalities and major injuries;

AND WHEREAS the Ontario Government discontinued the program and is yet to reinstate it in spite of numerous attempts made at the municipal level;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Premier of Ontario be requested to reinstitute the photo radar program for the provincially regulated Police Services Boards to manage and use at their discretion;

AND FURTHER THAT a copy of this resolution be forwarded to all Ontario Police Services Board Association members and all Ontario municipalities for their endorsement;

AND FURTHER THAT the Ontario Provincial Police, the Ontario Police Association and the Ontario Police Chief's Association be requested to support the resolution."
