MEDIA RELEASE

News items for the period between August 22nd and August 28th, 2011

Officers of the Gananoque Police Service investigated 60 occurrences during the seven day period ending August 28th, 2011. This included 16 criminal occurrences, 4 motor vehicle collisions, 5 calls to 911 for assistance. There were several charges under the Highway Traffic Act.

August 22, 2011

At approximately 12:23am a resident of Pine St. contacted Gananoque Police Service to advise of a fight on the street in front of his residence. Upon officer's arrival a 19 yr old male was observed on his knees on the sidewalk, bleeding from a cut on his head. EMS was dispatched and assessed the male who was subsequently taken to hospital for treatment. Further police investigation revealed that no fight had taken place, male had fallen due to his intoxicated state.

August 22, 2011

At approximately 3:02 pm Gananoque Police received a call of a shoplifting at a local pharmacy in Gananoque. Video surveillance identified a female believed to be in her 20's placing 3 bottles of perfume in her purse. Female was identified and was subsequently arrested for Theft Under \$5000 and Possession of Property Obtained by Crime Under \$5000. Female was released on a Promise to Appear and Undertaking to appear in court to answer to the charge.

August 26, 2011

At approximately 6:05 pm Gananoque Police Service received a call from a Kingston Group Home advising that one of their residents, a 16 yr old male, had walked away from a youth worker during an escorted outing to Gananoque. Male youth was last seen in the company of his girlfriend who lives in Gananoque. Police have not located the male youth. A warrant is being sought for the arrest of the youth for breaching a current court order release. Anyone with any information regarding the youth's whereabouts, please contact Gananoque Police Service.

August 26, 2011

Gananoque Police Service received a call from a local store owner advising that she is watching video surveillance that shows one adult female and one young offender female shoplifting merchandise from the store. Video surveillance showed that 3 items were taken from the store. Officers viewed the video surveillance and identified the females as a 38 yr old Gananoque resident and her 14 yr old daughter. After police investigation the adult female was charged with Theft Under \$5000 and Possession of Property Obtained by Crime Under \$5000 and released on a Promise to Appear and Undertaking. The female young offender entered into an Extra Judicial Measures Program as prescribed by the Youth Criminal Justice Act.

August 27, 2011

At approximately 6:07 pm officer while on patrol observed a male outside his residence that he knew to be wanted by Kingston Police. Male was subsequently arrested and returned to Kingston Police Service and turned over to their custody.

August 27, 2011

At approximately 11:04 pm the Gananoque Police Service received a call of disturbance on William Street South. Officers attended and determined a 24 year old male had left a licensed premise operating a motor vehicle in an intoxicated manner. A male victim attempted to stop the driver but was unsuccessful. The driver fled the area at a high rate of speed with the male victim hanging onto the side of the vehicle. The male driver was located in Napanee, arrested and charged with; operating a motor vehicle without a drivers license, operating a motor vehicle with no insurance; operating a motor vehicle with over 80 milligrams of alcohol; dangerous operation of a motor vehicle; and fail to remain at the scene of an accident. August 28, 2011

At approximately 9:26 am Gananoque Police Service received a call regarding a theft of 2 bicycles from the Clarion Inn sometime overnight. Bicycles were locked and sitting besides room 105 of the inn. Locks were cut from the bikes. Both bikes were Schwinn 21 speed mountain bikes. One bike was black and white with dual suspension and a carrier rack, the other bike was black and gray with front suspension and a carrier rack.
