# MEDIA RELEASE

## News items for the period between February 13<sup>th</sup> and February 19<sup>th</sup>, 2012

---

Officers of the Gananoque Police Service investigated 33 occurrences during the seven day period ending February 19<sup>th</sup>, 2012. This included 7 criminal occurrences, 6 calls to 911 for assistance, 2 Provincial Offense Notices and 2 Mental Health Act.

### February 13<sup>th</sup>, 2012

Police received a complaint of a male who refused to pay his rent at a King Street East hotel. Upon further investigation, the 54 year old male was found to have two warrants for his arrest from the Kingston Police Service. Male was arrested on the warrants and held until he was transported to the KPS.

### February 14<sup>th</sup>, 2012

A female who was scheduled to appear in court for a Theft Under \$5000 charge, failed to appear for her court date and a warrant was issued for her arrest. The 24 year old female turned herself in to the Gananoque Police Service where she was arrested and charged with Fail to Appear - Attend Court. She was later released on a Promise to Appear and Undertaking before an Officer in Charge and will appear in court at a later date.

### February 14<sup>th</sup>, 2012

Police responded to a call of an assault at a local group home. Upon arrival the 15 year old male was complacent and was arrested and charged with Assault, two counts of Mischief Under \$5000 and two counts of Beach of Probation. The male was held for a bail hearing.

### February 14<sup>th</sup>, 2012

Police received a report of a 15 year old male who was not following the conditions of his Recognizance of Bail. During the investigation, police were made aware of a sexual assault which took place between the young male and a female. Male was arrested and subsequently charged with Sexual Assault and Fail to Comply with Recognizance. The accused young person was held in custody for a Bail Hearing.

### **February 17<sup>th</sup>, 2012**

Police received a 911 call from a local business regarding a theft of numerous tools from the business's trailer which had been parked on Water Street. The items were stolen between Tuesday, February 14<sup>th</sup> and Friday, February 19<sup>th</sup>, 2012.

### **February 18<sup>th</sup>, 2012**

Police responded to a 911 call for a domestic disturbance. Upon arrival at the Hickory Street residence, officers located a male and a female engaged in a verbal dispute. Police advised both parties it was in their best interest to separate for the night and both were cautioned to keep the peace.

### **February 19<sup>th</sup>, 2012**

Police received a report of an intoxicated female walking down Maple Street. Officers attended and located the 17 year old female who was then transported to her residence and placed in the care of an adult. Later in the night police received a 911 call that the female was attempting to commit suicide. Police attended and EMS was contacted. Paramedics performed an assessment on the female. She was later apprehended under the Mental Health Act and transported by police to the Kingston General Hospital for further assessment.

### **February 19<sup>th</sup>, 2012**

Police received a report of an assault which occurred in the early morning hours outside a local King Street bar. A 21 year old female and a 21 year old male were assault by three other parties: a male and two females. Police are continuing to investigate the incident and suspect that criminal charges will be laid in the near future.

### **February 19<sup>th</sup>, 2012**

Police received a report of mischief to a vehicle which occurred late Friday night to Saturday morning at a Garden Street address. Damage is estimated at \$1000. Investigation ongoing.
