MEDIA RELEASE

News items for the period between January 9th and January 15th, 2012

Officers of the Gananoque Police Service investigated 35 occurrences during the seven day period ending January 15th, 2012. This included 5 criminal occurrences, 1 motor vehicle collisions and 5 calls to 911 for assistance. Police also issued 6 Provincial Offence Notices under the Highway Traffic Act and 16 Bylaw tickets for the Winter Parking.

January 9th, 2012

On January 9th, Officers responded to a reported domestic dispute at a south ward residence. An investigation was conducted resulting in a 26 year old female being arrested and charged with two counts of Breach of Probation. The female was later released on a Promise to Appear and Undertaking with multiple conditions and a court date in the future to answer to the charges.

January 10th, 2012

On January 10th, a male party attended the Gananoque Police Service to report the theft of a full sized refrigerator from the front porch of his north end residence. The theft occurred sometime between Sunday January 8th and Tuesday January 10th.

January 12th, 2012

On January 12th, the Gananoque Police Service received a report of a break and enter to an abandoned west ward property. Minimal damage was done and no items appear to have been taken.

January 13th, 2012

In the evening hours on January 13th, the Gananoque Police received a report of a 2 vehicle collision on the King Street bridge. No injuries were reported and both vehicles were driven from the scene.

January 15th, 2012

On January 15th the Gananoque Police received a report of a female breaching her release conditions at a main street establishment. An investigation was conducted confirming the reported female to be on multiple conditions. A 19 year old female was arrested and charged

with 2 counts of Fail to Comply with Undertaking Before an Officer in Charge. Female was held in custody for a Show Cause Bail Hearing.

The Gananoque Police Service would like to remind residents of the Winter Parking Bylaw which prohibits parking on the street between the hours of 1 a.m. and 7 a.m., from November 15th until April 1st. Any vehicles parked on the street will be ticketed and may be subject to being towed if the vehicle is impeding snow removal.

The Gananoque Police Service would like to remind residents there is a by-law regarding operating snowmobiles within the Town of Gananoque.

- No person shall operate a snow vehicle on any sidewalk.
- No person shall operate a snow vehicle at a rate of speed higher than 25 km/hr.
- No person shall operate a snow vehicle between 11pm and 7am.
- No person shall operate a snow vehicle along King Street between Victoria Avenue and Herbert Street.
