# MEDIA RELEASE

## News items for the period between July 10<sup>th</sup> and July 16<sup>th</sup>, 2011

---

Officers of the Gananoque Police Service investigated 76 occurrences during the seven day period ending July 16th, 2011. This included 13 criminal occurrences, 3 motor vehicle collisions and 6 calls to 911 for assistance.

### July 12<sup>th</sup>, 2011

On July 12th, 2011 the Gananoque Police Service received a shoplifting complaint from an east end business. An investigation was conducted resulting in a 19 year old male and a 17 year old female young offender being arrested and charged with Theft Under \$5000 and Possession of Stolen Property Under \$5000.

### July 13<sup>th</sup>, 2011

On July 13th, 2011 the Gananoque Police Service responded to a call reporting a male who had attempted to remove items without paying, from an east end business. Male returned items when confronted by staff. Male was located by officers and arrested for Public Intoxication. The 23 year old male was transported to station and held until sober. Male released on a Provincial Offences Notice for Being Intoxicated in a Public Place.

### July 15<sup>th</sup>, 2011

On July 15<sup>th</sup>, 2011 the Gananoque Police Service responded to a call for medical assistance at a Garden street address in regards to a male whose vital signs were absent. The 56 year old male was believed to have died from natural causes and his death is not considered suspicious. Name of the male party is being withheld pending notification of next of kin.
