# MEDIA RELEASE

## **News items for the period between June 13<sup>th</sup> and June 19<sup>th</sup>, 2011**

---

Officers of the Gananoque Police Service investigated 62 occurrences during the seven day period ending June 19th, 2011. This included 14 criminal occurrences, 2 motor vehicle collisions and 7 calls to 911 for assistance. Officers laid numerous charges under the Highway Traffic Act.

### **June 14<sup>th</sup>, 2011**

On June 14<sup>th</sup>, 2011 officers of the Gananoque Police Service along with officers from Project Islander executed a CDSA search warrant on a Gananoque residence. As a result a 24 year old male and a 24 year old female were each arrested and charged with possession for the purpose of trafficking marihuana, and production of a schedule II substance – marihuana. Both were released on a Promise to Appear in court at a later date.

### **June 19<sup>th</sup>, 2011**

On June 19<sup>th</sup>, 2011 officers of the Gananoque Police Service responded to a 911 call of a domestic at a Gananoque residence. As a result a 20 year old female was arrested and charged with domestic mischief, and assault. The female was released on a Promise to Appear and an Undertaking to appear in court at a later date.

Gananoque Police are investigating three commercial break and enters that occurred overnight Sunday night. Local businesses owners are reminded to keep their premises locked and to remove or lock all money/valuables while closed. Anyone with information regarding these incidents is asked to call Gananoque Police Service, or Crimestoppers.

Gananoque Police Service is reminding residents to keep their bicycles stored and/or locked. Police experience an increased volume of bicycle thefts in the summer months. Bike owners are also encouraged to record their serial numbers for identification purposes in case of a theft.

The Gananoque Police Service would like to encourage parents of children under the age of 16 years to ensure their children wear a proper bicycle helmet when riding a bicycle. Parent's who fail to do so, under the Ontario Traffic Act, could be issued an \$80.00 fine.
