## News items for the period between March 28<sup>th</sup> and April 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2011

---

Officers of the Gananoque Police Service investigated 54 occurrences during the seven day period ending April 3rd, 2011. This included 10 criminal occurrences, 3 motor vehicle collisions, 4 calls to 911 for assistance and 1 Liquor Licence Act occurrence.

### March 28<sup>th</sup>, 2011

On March 28<sup>th</sup>, 2011 a 45 year old male was arrested on an outstanding warrant from 2008 for Theft Under \$5000 and Breach of Probation. The male was released on a Promise to Appear and Undertaking with conditions and a court date in the near future.

### April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2011

Officers of the Gananoque Police Service attended a King Street East establishment regarding an unwanted person attempting to enter. Officers attended and investigation revealed the person to be intoxicated. A 31 year old male was arrested for Being Intoxicated in a Public Place and held in custody until sober.

### **The Gananoque Police Service wants you to add some I.C.E. to your cell phone.**

You can help Police, Fire & Paramedics help you by adding "ICE" (IN CASE OF EMERGENCY) information to your cell phone. In case of emergency police, fire and paramedics will look in a cell phone's directory to locate family or trusted friends they can contact to let them know you have been in an emergency.

It's simple. You contact your parents, family members or trusted friends and ask them to be one of your emergency contacts.

Program your cell phone with: ICE 1, ICE 2, ICE 3, ICE 4

If you have a medical condition that requires attention like diabetes, heart condition, etc., **PLEASE** inform your contacts and carry either a medic alert bracelet or card or some form of information card or bracelet to help emergency services help you.

This "ICE" program is the brainchild of a Paramedic.

**DO NOT PROGRAM 911 INTO YOUR CELL PHONE**

**The GANANOQUE POLICE SERVICE wants to remind the citizens of Gananoque of bicycle helmet laws.**

The Ontario Highway Traffic Act states “No person shall ride or operate a bicycle on a highway unless the person is wearing a bicycle helmet that complies with the regulations and the chin strap of the helmet is securely fastened under the chin.” The Ontario Highway Traffic Act further states that a person who is 18 years of age or older is not required to comply with the Act. It is the duty of a Parent or Guardian of a person under sixteen years of age to ensure that this person who rides on or operates a bicycle on a highway, is wearing a bicycle helmet. If a Gananoque Police Service officer observes a person not complying with these laws, they could be given a fine of \$80.00.

**The police enforce these laws for your safety and your protection.**
