MEDIA RELEASE

News items for the period between November 13th and November 19th, 2011

Officers of the Gananoque Police Service investigated 67 occurrences during the seven day period ending November 19th, 2011. This included 24 criminal occurrences, 7 motor vehicle collisions, 18 calls to 911 for assistance and 7 Provincial Offence Notices issued.

November 13th, 2011

On November 13th 2011 Officers received a complaint regarding a female not compiling with her bail conditions. Officers located and arrested a 19 year old female for failing to comply with her bail conditions. The female was released on a promise to appear to appear in court at a later date.

November 16th, 2011

On November 16th, 2011 officers responded along with ambulance and fire to an accident in the parking lot of an east end business. An elderly male had suffered a medical episode while driving his vehicle in the parking lot and ended up hitting another vehicle. Male was assisted by emergency personnel and transported to Kingston General Hospital by ambulance for treatment.

November 18th, 2011

On November 18th, 2011 Officers while conducting a R.I.D.E program arrested and charged a 44 year old male with possession with a substance under the controlled substance Act. The male was released on appearance notice to later appear in Court.

November 19th, 2011

The Gananoque Police Service received a report of a local resident receiving calls from a company claiming to be Microsoft Computer Company/Windows. This business is believed to be fraudulent, having no credentials that link them to Microsoft/Windows and have reportedly contacted numerous local residents in attempts to gain access to their personal information via their computers. Gananoque residents are reminded to use caution when receiving calls for computer services when they have not been requested

R.I.D.E. PROGRAM

Officers of the Gananoque Police Service conducted R.I.D.E programs November 17th and November 18th approximately 500 vehicles were checked, Officers issued 30 cautions for violations under the Highway Traffic Act. Officers charged one person under the Criminal Code. The Gananoque Police will continue R.I.D.E programs throughout the holiday season.

Winter Parking Restrictions

The Gananoque Police Service would like to remind citizens that **Winter Parking** begins November 15th, 2011 and runs until April 1st, 2011. No vehicles may be parked on the street between the hours of 1 a.m. and 7 a.m.. Vehicles left on the street may be ticketed and may also be towed if they are interfering with snow removal.
