Officers of the Gananoque Police Service investigated 50 occurrences during the seven day period ending October 2nd, 2011. This included 10 criminal occurrences, 1 motor vehicle collision, 6 calls to 911 for assistance. Officers issued three tickets for various offences under the Highway Traffic Act.

September 26th, 2011

Officers responded to a call of a suicidal female at a King Street address. As a result a 48 year old female was apprehended under the Mental Health Act and transported to Brockville General Hospital for assessment.

September 27th, 2011

Officers responded to a concern for well being call at a Garden Street address. As a result a 62 year old female was transported by ambulance to Kingston General Hospital for a mental health assessment.

September 28th, 2011

Officers responded to a call of a distraught emotional female at a King Street address. As a result a 48 year old female was transported to Brockville General Hospital for a mental health assessment.

September 30th, 2011

Officers responded to a call for assistance with a mental health patient at a King Street address. As a result a 58 year old male was apprehended under the Mental Health Act and transported to Brockville General Hospital for assessment.

October 2nd, 2011

Officers responded to a 911 call of a female being attacked by a male at a Henrietta Street address. As a result a 27 year old male was arrested and charged with Assault Cause Bodily harm and Utter Threat to cause Death. Further investigation resulted in additional charges of Assault with a Weapon, Possession of Weapon for dangerous Purpose, and Utter Threat to cause Death. Male was held in custody for a bail hearing.
