Noise By-Law Presentation – John Nalon

John Nalon attended regarding the noise complaint by-law and the experience he had last summer. Chief Liu advised that one ticket relating to the Noise By-Law has been issued in 2011.

PSB Training –OAPSB – An update on the status of the PSB training was discussed and correspondence was attached to the package.

Lockdown Training is being provided by Smiths Falls Police Service. Handouts provided. There are no costs associated with training. Chief Liu and Anne Warrant will attend. Neil McCarney is undecided.

Accident Support Services International Limited – A memorandum of understanding has been signed between the organization and the Gananoque Police Service. Training with this organization is scheduled for Monday, March 21, 2011. Training on this system “CROMS” – Collision Reporting Occurrence Management System will be provided and board members are invited to attend.

Chief Liu provided an overview of monthly variance and statistical reports. Concerns were raised regarding overtime and police visibility. The Board would like to be provided with more specific details on foot patrol.

One concern raised was Police parking in the “No Parking Zone” on King Street in front of the Hot Roast Company. Chief Liu advised that this is a designated police parking spot. This creates for higher visibility. Proper signage is visible.

Courtesy Crosswalk – this issue is being dealt with by Council. Even though signage is posted vehicles still have the right of way under the Highway Traffic Act.

The Gananoque Police Service budget was approved with a 5.27% increase.

Charges Laid for Commercial Break-Ins Across the Province

172 Charges Laid

(Smiths Falls, ON.) – A joint investigation conducted by the Bancroft OPP Crime Unit and the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) Eastern Region – Rural and Agricultural Crime Team (RACT), has led to the arrest of a male responsible for several night-time, commercial, break and enters across Ontario.

With the assistance of the Belleville Police Service, Smiths Falls Police Service, Tyendinaga Police Service, Gananoque Police Service, Midland Police Service, Port Hope Police Service, and the Stirling Rawdon Police Service, as well as OPP Detachments in Prince Edward County, Leeds County, Rideau Lakes and Peterborough, investigators arrested and charged 27-year-old Allan LAIDLEY of Belleville, Ontario with:

1. Break Enter and Theft (42 counts)
2. Possession of Stolen Property OVER \$5000 (3 counts)
3. Possession of Stolen Property UNDER \$5000 (33 counts)
