



## GANANOQUE POLICE SERVICE

Officers of the Gananoque Police Service investigated 57 occurrences during the seven day period ending September 18<sup>th</sup>, 2011. This included 8 criminal occurrences, 5 motor vehicle collisions, 7 calls to 911 for assistance and 8 Highway Traffic Act tickets.

### **September 12<sup>th</sup>, 2011**

On September 12<sup>th</sup>, 2011 officers of the Gananoque Police Service received two 911 calls to attend a two vehicle collision on Stone Street. No injuries were reported. One 18 year old female driver was charged under the Highway Traffic Act for Careless Driving. Both vehicles were damaged and towed from the scene.

### **September 13<sup>th</sup>, 2011**

On September 13<sup>th</sup>, 2011 officers while on patrol intercepted a female in the midst of contacting 911. Female reported that she felt harassed by her spouse and requested he be removed from the residence for the night. Male complied with request and left without incident.

### **September 14<sup>th</sup>, 2011**

On September 14<sup>th</sup>, 2011 members of the Gananoque Police Service, the Gananoque Fire Department, and Leeds and Grenville EMS responded to a 911 call of a young male who had collapsed on the street at a Stone Street address. The unconscious 15 year old male had regained consciousness upon arrival. The male was assessed by paramedics but declined any further treatment and walked from the scene.

### **September 15<sup>th</sup>, 2011**

On September 15<sup>th</sup>, 2011 Officers responded to a report of a delivery truck blocking one full lane of traffic and refusing to move on King Street East near the Town Hall. Officer attended on scene and observed vehicle parked blocking e/b traffic in the driving lane. Officer issued driver Provincial Offences Notice for Obstruct Traffic.

On September 15<sup>th</sup>, 2011 members of the Gananoque Police Service responded along with ambulance to a 911 call of an injured male at a Garden Street address. The male had been riding his bike and texting at the same time when he drove into the back of a parked pickup truck. The male was assessed by paramedics and transported to Kingston General Hospital for further treatment.

### **September 16<sup>th</sup>, 2011**

On September 16<sup>th</sup>, 2011 the Gananoque Police Service received a report of 3 Stihl leaf blowers that had been stolen from a west end residence sometime overnight. The leaf blowers were valued at approximately \$300.00 each.

On September 16<sup>th</sup>, 2011 the Gananoque Police Service received a report of a vehicle striking another vehicle in the side in front of the Metro on King Street East. No injuries were sustained during the accident. A 62 year old female driver was charged with Change Lane Not in Safety contrary to the Highway Traffic Act.

### **September 17<sup>th</sup>, 2011**

On September 17<sup>th</sup>, 2011 the Gananoque Police Service received a complaint of a loud party at a south ward residence. Officers attended residence and observed persons in the rear yard talking normally. Officers did not observe any loud voices or music in the area. Officers spoke to resident and advised of complaint and cautioned under noise bylaw.

On September 17<sup>th</sup>, the Gananoque Police Service received a request from the OPP to check a west end residence. OPP advised they responded to an MVC on Highway 32 just north of Highway 401 and the driver was not on scene. Vehicle is registered to a female at the west end residence. Officers assisted OPP with locating the owner, driver and passengers of the vehicle to determine they had not sustained injuries in the crash.

### **September 18<sup>th</sup>, 2011**

On September 18<sup>th</sup>, 2011 the Gananoque Police Service received information of a theft which occurred overnight at the Gananoque Legion. Over the course of the night an American flag was taken from outside the address which is similar to an occurrence approximately three weeks ago in which a Canadian flag was taken. Any information regarding either incident can be forwarded anonymously to the Gananoque Police Service.
