Officers of the Gananoque Police Service investigated 46 occurrences during the seven day period ending September 25th, 2011. This included 11 criminal occurrences, 1 motor vehicle collisions, 4 calls to 911 for assistance and 2 Highway Traffic Act tickets.

September 19th, 2011

On September 19th, 2011 officers of the Gananoque Police Service received a report of items stolen from the yard of a Charles Street residence. Items stolen include: steel, copper, batteries, hot water tank, lawn mower, bucket seats and a weed eater.

September 19th, 2011

On September 19th, 2011 officers attended a local business to arrest a 15 year old male responsible for a mischief to the building which occurred the previous day. As a result the male was arrested and charged with Mischief Under \$5000 and Utter Threat to Cause Death. He was released on a Promise to Appear and Undertaking and will appear in court at a later date.

September 19th, 2011

On September 19th, 2011 the Gananoque Police Service received a report of a theft at a Stone Street residence. The complainant reports a dual tank compressor, yellow in colour was taken from the residence and holds a value of \$200.00.

September 20th, 2011

On September 20th, 2001 Officers responded to a report of a male lying on the ground on First Street. Officers attended and found the 54 year old male to be intoxicated. Male was transported to the station to sober up and was given a Provincial Offense Notice for having liquor in open container in other than licensed premises, residence or private place. Male was released once sober.

September 21st, 2011

On September 21st, 2011 the Gananoque Police Service received confirmation that a 28 year old male had been located and arrested by Durham PS, under a warrant for committal held by the Gananoque Police Service. Male was released on a Promise to Appear.

September 21st, 2011

On September 21st, 2011 the officers of the Gananoque Police Service responded to a break and enter at an Elizabeth Street address. The complainant reports leaving the residence briefly and upon returning, finding the back door forced open and numerous footprints in the residence. Officers searched neighbouring properties and surrounding areas for suspects with negative results. Evidence found at the scene was documented and will be processed. Complainant reports several valuable items of jewelry were taken.

September 22nd, 2011

On September 22nd, 2011 the Gananoque Police Service received information of a resident receiving numerous calls from a company claiming to be Microsoft Computer Company/Windows. This business is believed to be fraudulent, having no credentials that link them to Microsoft/Windows and have reportedly contacted numerous local residents in attempts to gain access to their personal information via their computers. Gananoque residents are cautioned when receiving such calls.

September 24th, 2011

On September 24th, 2011 officers responded to a report of a domestic dispute. Upon arrival, a 48 year old female was found to be agitated and uncooperative. Officers arrested female who became violent and was transported to the station. Female was released at a later time unconditionally later when she had calmed down.

September 25th, 2011

On September 25th, 2011 The Gananoque Police Service responded to a break and enter at an Elmwood Drive residence. Victim reports being away from the residence for the majority of the day and upon return found scarring on the wood of the door, drawers and closet doors ajar and several valuable jewelry items missing. Compl reports two bottles of perfume and various currencies taken as well. Neighbouring residents report seeing no one in the vicinity.

September 25th, 2011

On September 25th, 2011 officers responded to a report of two missing youths from a Sydenham Street residence. Both males were believed to be travelling West out of Gananoque in attempts to reach Kingston. The Gananoque Police Service contacted local police agencies to be on the lookout for the youths. Officers received information that one youth had returned to the residence and shortly after the second was located. Both males are on probation and charges for breach of probation are being considered.

The Gananoque Police Service would like to remind people to secure all doors and windows when they are away from their residences. With the recent increase of daytime break and enters residents of Gananoque are asked to contact the Gananoque Police if they observe suspicious activity at or near their neighbour's property.
